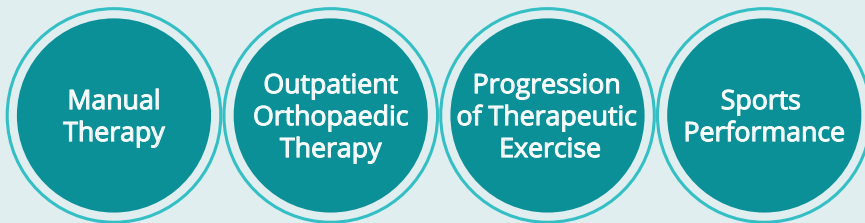

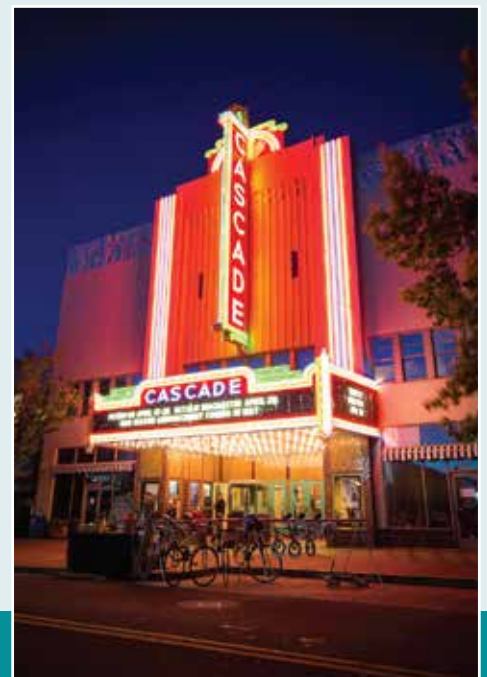
Working with Liberty Physical Therapy is an opportunity to combine an outstanding medical career with a rare quality of life.
